THURSDAY ALL DAY MEDALTA DAY TRIP

Medalta is an innovative industrial museum, contemporary ceramic arts facility, art gallery and community hub in Medicine Hat, Alberta. Thursday there will be an optional day trip to visit the converted century-old factory, which has become an exciting place where cutting edge ceramics art and technology, historic restoration and archaeology come together.

Medalta Potteries is the setting for a living museum, a vibrant educational centre, public gallery, and the 12,000 square foot Shaw International Centre for Contemporary Ceramics.

The original Medalta factory is one of Alberta's major heritage buildings. Vast quantities of the original clay remains in the warehouses and much of the equipment is still in its original place and ready to be restarted. A sample of railway cars awaits the shipping of finished products. Original and rare ceramic works are on display throughout the complex.
